While the STL Pipeline continues to operate today, on Dec. 13, its current certificate to operate expires.

Here's how you can prepare:

- Only heat your home with appliances designed for safe space heating. Grills, ovens, space heaters and fires outside of a working fireplace can pose safety hazards
- Take steps to prevent **pipes** from freezing
- Install and test your smoke alarm and carbon monoxide detectors to make sure they're working properly and have extra batteries on hand
- Keep back-up generators a safe distance from your home to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning

- Use UL-certified surge protectors to keep from overloading your electrical wiring
- Ensure you have plenty of emergency supplies like blankets, warm clothing and non-perishable food that can be microwaved if it needs to be heated
- Seal areas around your home where air can leak in—around windows, chimneys, fireplaces, unfinished spaces behind cupboards, etc.
- Ensure the fireplace, flue and chimney in your home are in working order before using
